## What We Do

The Clinic is only for people who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait islander and who want to come along. The Clinic is suitable if you would benefit for a review of your care and have one or more of the following health conditions:

- Diabetes (Endocrinology)
- Breathing problems (Respiratory)
- Heart issues (Cardiology)
- Kidney problems (Nephrology/Renal)
- Gut problems (Gastroenterology)

## More about the clinic

The Clinic occurs every Wednesday morning at Sunshine Hospital.

The Clinic Doctors are from General Medicine and they consult with other medical specialists on the day, as required.

An Aboriginal Hospital Liaison Officer (AHLO) will see you at the Clinic and is able to provide cultural support and help you participate in decisions about your care.

Appointments are longer, and healthy food is provided. Transport or assistance with car parking costs is possible.
