Provides individualised support to young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples who are at risk or have been in contact with police or the youth justice system.

The Deadly Lions mission is to empower young people who identify Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander by providing culturally appropriate support and advocacy and facilitating a sense of identity through spiritual, cultural and community reconnection.

Intensive case management and coordination, brief intervention, assertive outreach, pro-social role modelling and guidance, community engagement, family work and connection to culture.

Program eligibility

To be eligible for Bundji Bundji or Tiddas program you must be

Residing in the North-West region of Melbourne

Aged 10-25 years of age, who are serving community-based orders in North-West metropolitan Melbourne or 'at risk' of entering the Justice System.
