We Al-li's professional development workshops, Dadirri and Trauma-informed Care & practice: An Indigenous Approach to Developing Working Skills, are specifically designed for individuals working in the Human Services, Social Work, Health/Well-being, and Education sectors. These workshops equip participants with the practical skills necessary to work with the First Nations community in a trauma-informed and culturally safe way.

WHAT IS WE AL-LI?

We Al-li workshops embrace concepts and principles that centre an Indigenous understanding and learning, which provide curiosity and compassion for those who attend. Culturally informed care in practice requires lifelong learning. This course is built on knowledge sharing. The word education comes from the Latin educare - to draw out from - to lead - to show the way. We Al-li draws from the philosophy of educating. A person who educares is a person who has walked the path of learning and, through the application of knowledge in wise action, draws out from others their own ability to learn.

WHO IS AUNTY JUDY ATKINSON?

Prof. Atkinson is a Jiman (central west Queensland) and Bundjalung (northern New South Wales) woman of Anglo-Celtic and German heritage. She is the author of Trauma Trails—Recreating Songlines: The Transgenerational Effects of Trauma in Indigenous Australia and is recognised for her academic contributions to understanding trauma-related issues.

Aunty Judy has won numerous awards for her innovative teaching practices, curriculum development, and commitment to healing and recovering Indigenous peoples from trauma. She is also the Patron of the We Al-li Trust and continues to work on community-based violence-trauma-specific recovery programs in Australia and Papua New Guinea.
